13. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

14. DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS REPORT

14.1 District Councillors Report

Both not at meeting – apologies sent and the annual report was sent through which is now on the Parish Council Web Site – the following are highlights from that report sent through by District Cllr R. Kybird:-

- 1. 2400 trees planted at Oxborough Hall
- 2. 40% of households now use the Brown Bin Service composting 10,000 Tonnes of garden waste
- 3. They have channelled Defra funding for community orchards
- 4. They have provided support for Community celebrations of the King's Coronation
- 5. They are now in the top 100 of Councils in tackling fly tipping

- 6. They have supported youth mental health through the mindful District scheme
- 7. They have offered grants in support of D Day commemorations
- 8. They have provided funding for Debt advisors
- 9. They still have the lowest Council Tax.

More locally it is hoped that the County Council Planning approval will enable operational monitoring and enforcement to be applied to the second Brandon railway siding.

Grimes Graves is now reopened and the project officer Robin Sullivan informs me that the weekend of 15 and 16 June will be the Grimes Graves Flint festival featuring special guest Phil Harding of time team fame.

14.2 County Councillors Report

County Cllr Fabian Eagle said that he hopes the Swift Tower will do a good job.

He went on to say he would be able to give us £1,000 towards the trod from his last years budget (we had hoped for £6,000 see item 15.1 a)

Verge cutting – visibility splays are now being cut and will be cut again when necessary.

Rural Business Awards – we are not down to the short list and preparing for the finals.

15. MATTERS ARISING

15.1 Outstanding Highway Matters – to discuss any outstanding issues and to report any new issues

- a) Trod Funding update on extra £6,000 that has been requested from Cllr Eagles annual allowance Cllr Eagle has £1,000 to put towards this but is unable to commit to the other £5,000, this means that the Parish Council would need to put £11,000 towards this if the project goes ahead.
- b) To discuss any other Highways matters that have been arisen since the agenda was issued The speed limit sign with rotting post on Lynn Road has been reported to Highways and they have come back to confirm this will be repaired.

The speed limit sign that had fallen over on Hockwold Road has been reported to Highways and they have also confirmed that this will be put back into place.

15.2 Playing Field/Open Spaces/ Amenities

- a) Village Hall Drive To discuss quote received for the re-opening of entrance to overflow carpark price received £3258 following a discussion it was agreed not to go ahead with this at this time.
- b) Chain Link fence on Playing Field Boundary to discuss repairs there is damage in the first 25 yards of the fence – following a discussion it was agreed to replace the damaged fencing and the Clerk will obtain some quotes.
- c) Fence alongside the carpark railing between the car park and the play area needs replacing The Clerk look for obtain a price
- d) Vandalized Electricity Cupboard to note that the new door has been fitted.
- e) Replacement swing to discuss and agree quotes received for the replacement double swing Quotes received from two suppliers Wickstead and Online Playgrounds(Fenland Leisure)

Straight replacement of two swings Fenland £4005 - Wickstead £6603

1 junior flat swing and 1 disabled Fenland £4655 - Wickstead £8266

2 Junior Flat swings and 1 disabled Fenland £6490 - Wickstead quote not received

All quotes include safety matting which also needs replacing.

16.1 Street Lighting report and to discuss 5 yearly inspection of lamps

We have received the following notification regarding a 5 yearly annual inspection: -- It is a requirement of BS7671:2018 (IET Wiring Regulations 18th Edition) that all fixed wired electrical installations are inspected, tested, and certified as safe every 5 years. This includes all street furniture (street lighting columns). The cost of this is £15.00 a column – WPC have $116 - \cos t$ will be £1740

Following a discussion, it was agreed to instruct the lighting contractors to go ahead with this. A resident on St Edmunds is complaining that the new LED on column 33 not bright enough.
