**6.1 District Councillors Report**

District Cllr Kybird said the debris reported has been cleared in Saxon Place.

With regards to the trench across the village hall drive in Saxon Place – Breckland are aware of this.

**6.2 County Councillors Report**

Cllr Fabian Eagle said the budget will be set on 17<sup>th</sup> February, he explained that some funding has been lost, the good news is that they are able to keep the extra verge cutting for next year.

Cllr Eagle will be showcasing the various businesses that are in Norfolk.

They have launched the connect to work scheme.

He has just over £1,000 left in his community fund that is available or local community groups.

**7. MATTERS ARISING**

**7.1 Outstanding Highway Matters – to discuss any outstanding issues and to report any new issues.**

- a) Park View – damaged drain – reported to highways – Still outstanding and getting worse, the Chair has reported this again.
- b) Lynn Road – dangerous trees – reported to highways.
- c) Lynn Road junction with Hereward Way - road damage reported to highways – get on to Highways again as getting worse –*this has now been chased up again by the Clerk.*
- d) Lynn Road – subsidence – reported to highways.
- e) Hereward Way (not Saxon Place which was a typing error on the agenda) – Parking and tarmac area outside the garage – reported to Highways and received a reply suggesting that the Parish Council contact them directly. The Chair hi-lighted this to County Cllr Fabian Eagle – *The Clerk has since forwarded a copy of the email to Cllr Eagle.*
- f) Hereward Way – surface is cracking up outside the garage – previously reported to Breckland.
- g) Saxon Place – trench running across village hall entrance is sinking – Clerk has reported this to Breckland and district Cllr Robert Kybird said that Breckland are aware of this and are dealing with it.
- h) Saxon Place – opposite the Village Hall drive – there is growth and muck that a resident has complained about stating that it is smelly – Clerk has reported this to Breckland, and this has now been cleared. The resident expressed his thanks to Cllr Peter Nordan.

With regard to the £8841.20 it was agreed that the Clerk obtain a quote for new secure doors for the football changing room and apply for money to go towards this out of this amount.

- b) Memorial Bench for Destiny – Destiny's family to confirm when and where the bench is to be installed. – they are still to confirm where this is to be installed
